

Waiver of Subrogation

Definition:

A waiver of subrogation provision prevents the insurance company (who steps into the shoes of the insured after it pays a loss) from suing the other party to the contract – which likely caused the loss.

Standard Language:

Vendor/Contractor/Operator hereby grants to the County of Riverside (County) waiver of subrogation which any insurer may acquire against the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers, from Vendor/Contractor/Operator by virtue of the payment of any loss. Vendor/Contractor/Operator agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the County has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.

The Workers Compensation policy shall be endorsed with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the County for all work performed by the Vendor/Contractor/Operator, its employees, agents, and subcontractors.

If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit. Policy shall name the County as Additional Insureds.
